

**CITY OF LANGLEY, WASHINGTON
ORDINANCE NO. ____**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LANGLEY,
WASHINGTON, ADDING A NEW CHAPTER 3.62 TO THE
LANGLEY MUNICIPAL CODE ENTITLED “PUBLIC WORKS
VEHICLE/EQUIPMENT RESERVE FUND”; PROVIDING FOR
SEVERABILITY AND EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, the City has kept a reserve fund within its Municipal Capital Reserve Fund, for the accumulation of monies to purchase and do major repairs of vehicles and equipment for the Public Works Department; and

WHEREAS, the State Auditor’s office has advised that only monies of a governmental nature be kept in the Municipal Capital Improvement Fund and that separate reserves are to be established for proprietary/enterprise funds;

**NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LANGLEY,
WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. The Langley Municipal Code is hereby amended to add a new Chapter 3.62 to read as follows:

Chapter 3.62

Public Works Vehicle/Equipment Reserve Fund

Sections:

- 3.62.010 Established.**
- 3.62.020 Transfer of funds.**
- 3.62.030 Deposit of funds.**
- 3.62.040 Expenditures.**

Section 3.62.010 Established.

There is established a separate fund within the city to be known as the "Public Works Vehicle/Equipment Reserve Fund No.406. The purpose of this fund shall be as stated in LMC 3.60.040.

Section 3.62.020 Transfer of funds.

The city clerk/treasurer is ordered and directed to transfer all monies held in the City’s Municipal Capital Reserve Fund No. 303 from the Street, Water, Sewer and Storm-water funds that are reserved for the purchase and major repair of vehicles and equipment into the Public Works Vehicle/Equipment Fund No 406 established by this ordinance

Section 3.62.030 Deposit of funds.

Thenceforth, all transfers from the Street Fund, Water, Sewer and Storm-water Funds meant for vehicles and equipment which is consistent with the purpose of this fund shall be placed in this special fund.

Section 3.62.040 Expenditures / Purpose

Expenditures from the fund shall be made only for the purpose of purchasing or doing major repairs of vehicles and equipment for the public works department.

Section 2. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect five (5) days after publication and posting of an approved summary thereof, consisting of the title.
