

Request for Proposal Hladky Park Upgrades

The City of Langley is seeking a design open to all artisans for a pedestrian assistance handrails. The handrails must be designed to assist pedestrians entering and exiting Seawall Park through the steepest areas of the Hladky Park area. The handrails must be designed to be functional and attractive. Design must be constructed of low maintenance weather resistant materials

The Langley Arts Commission selection guidelines will be based on pedestrian safety, artistic quality, and uniqueness of design, durability, maintenance requirements, ease of construction and the ability complete project within 60 days from award. Artisan collaborations are encouraged. Island County artisans will receive preference in the selection process.

Estimated start of construction and installation of the handrails and benches will take place in the first week of August, 2017, to be completed within 60 days of after the effective date, artisans and the City of Langley enter into a contract.

The City of Langley budget for construction and installation of the handrails is between \$5000 and \$7000.

Artisan's agreement Overview:

The work under this agreement is for the Contractors to create, construct and install handrails, in collaboration with the City as follows:

- 1. Work with the Arts Commission and the Langley Public Works Department to find agreement on the aesthetic values of handrails in terms of selection of materials and relative handrails size.**
- 2. Work with the Public Works Department to meet City Code requirements, including but not limited to handrail footings and pedestrian safety.**
- 3. Keep the City informed of any problems that arise during creation, construction and handrails installation**

Interested Artisans can request a site inspection prior to submission by contacting Stan Berryman, Director of the Langley Public Works Department.

Application Guidelines:

- 1. Current qualifications: not to exceed two pages.**
 - 2. Drawings depicting handrail design and recommended locations.**
 - 3. An installation plan.**
 - 4. Timeline of activities to reach completion of project 60 days after the effective contract date.**
 - 5. A one-paragraph artisan statement.**
- 2. A stamped self-addressed envelope must be included if return of submission materials is desired.**
 - 3. All images must be submitted in JPEG format (file name extension .jpg) and RGB color mode. We recommend uploading files that are 72 pixels-per-inch (ppi) because a higher resolution does not add clarity when viewing images on a computer screen. It is recommended that applicants keep copies of original images.**

The deadline for USPS, hand delivery and digital email is 11 August 2017.
