**Seawall Park Ad Hoc Committee Meeting  
January 30, 2017**

**Discussion: Commonalities, areas of consensus**

1. Theme: Native American/Coast Salish, Environmental, Historical  
Reflected throughout park in design, colors, signage
2. Cleanup: Remove invasive plants, landscape, make it look cared for
3. Improve access at both ends “Artistic gateway” at Anthes; east end for ADA access
4. Landscaped path/stairs at the Anthes entrance that are switchback or that curve so pedestrians can avoid the steep blacktop access road
5. Signage:  
Wayfinding to the park and interpretative placards for example, history, environment, geography
6. A distinct, landscaped promenade that parallels the waterfront
7. East end of park “attractions.” Examples:
  - Play/exercise equipment
  - Something such as art that is iconic, energizing and inviting
  - A lookout tower/viewing platform/and/or a telescope
  - Fire pit with seating
  - A shelter for events with changing rooms/restrooms
8. Minimal outdoor furniture: Benches, picnic tables
9. Clean up hillsides on private property and/or screen from view of park
